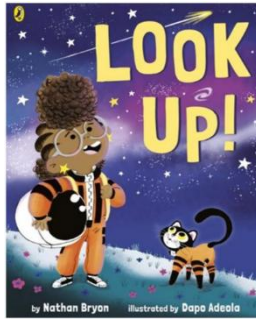


English

We will start the year by studying the book *Look Up!* by Nathan Bryon which is about a girl who is passionate about space and wants to share this with everyone around her. Using the skills learned throughout the unit, children will write a diary entry about a space flight.



We will then read *The Great Fire of London* by Emma Adams and James Weston, all about the great fire. We will explore the days before and immediately after the fire and read the recounts of witnesses. We will take into account the vocabulary used and descriptive language, adjectives and verbs to describe how the fire started and how it continued as it engulfed the city.

Maths

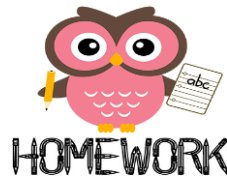
In Maths we will continue to consolidate our understanding of the Year 1 objectives alongside extending our knowledge of the Year 2 concepts including:

- Number & Place Value
- Addition & Subtraction
- Multiplication & Division
- Fractions



We will also be doing daily morning mental maths practice on the four operations and learning our times tables – 2's, 5's and 10's.

Homework



Children will be set spellings and times tables each week on Dojo. The spellings for the term, which are from the Year 2 spelling list, are on Dojo for you to access each week.

Reading books will be issued on a Friday and collected back in each Thursday. Separate Reading Challenge books will also be given to your child along with a book review and date they are to be returned.

Science

In Science, our first topic is *Uses of Everyday Materials*. Throughout this topic we will look at the properties and features of different materials, investigating how they can be changed by squashing, twisting and bending. We will then carry out a number of investigations to find the most suitable materials to make different items and structures. We will be working with lots of different materials including wood, metal, plastic, rock, and cardboard to work out how they are suited to different uses.



We will move onto *Living Things and their Habitats*. We will be comparing the differences between living things, non-living things and things that have never been alive. We will study the life processes of living things and why they are suited to their habitats. We will observe different micro habitats around our school and create our own bug hotel as a safe place for minibeasts to shelter. We will finish our topic by learning all about food chains, naming and identifying different sources of food.

RE

In RE we will be looking the topic of Creation and Covenant. During this topic we will learn about the story of Noah's Ark and how the water and rainbows symbolise God's Promise to be with us always.



We will then move onto look at the sacrament of Baptism and how the water symbolises the promise we make to be a part of God's family. God promises us that when we are washed with the waters of Baptism he will be with us always.

Finally we look at the gift of creation that God sent after the flood in Noah's Ark and how the pope has asked us through Fratelli Tutti to look after it and be stewards of God's creation.

This term we will be looking at the very important people in our lives and the ways in which we can make our relationships happy and positive.
